2. McMahon-Hussein Correspondence

July 1915—Lieutenant Colonel Sir Henry McMahon, British High Commissioner to Egypt, writes a letter to Hussein bin Ali, Sharif of Mecca, recognizing Arab independence after the war in exchange for the launching the Arab Revolt against the Ottoman Empire.

- A. To counteract the Ottoman declaration of Jihad against the Allies
- B. To maintain the support of the 70 million Muslims in British India

3. Sykes-Picot Agreement

January 1916—A secret treaty between the United Kingdom and France, with assent from Russia and Italy, to define their mutually agreed spheres of influence and control in an eventual partition of the Ottoman Empire.

- A. British Mandate—would control Palestine, Jordan, and Iraq.
- B. French Mandate—would control SE Turkey, Kurdistan, Syria, and Lebanon.

4. Balfour Declaration

November 1917—United Kingdom's Foreign Secretary Arthur Balfour to Lord Rothschild, a leader of the British Jewish community, announcing its support for the establishment of a "national home for the Jewish people" in Palestine, then an Ottoman region with a small minority Jewish population.
