INTRO:

I. → Psalms 139:7-18

Where can I go from your Spirit? Where can I flee from your presence? If I go up to the heavens, you are there; if I make my bed in Sheol, you are there. If I rise on the wings of the dawn, if I settle on the far side of the sea, even there your hand will guide me, your right hand will hold me fast. \rightarrow 11 If I say, "Surely the darkness will hide me and the light become night around me," even the darkness will not be dark to you; the night will shine like the day, for darkness is as light to you. → 13 For you created my inmost being; you knit me together in my mother's womb. *I praise you because I am fearfully and wonderfully made;* your works are wonderful, I know that full well. *My frame was not hidden from you* when I was made in the secret place, when I was woven together in the depths of the earth. - A. <u>The Spirit has a perspective that is far beyond our own.</u>
 - 1) Psalms 33:13-15

From heaven the Lord looks down and sees all mankind; from his dwelling place he watches all who live on earth he who forms the hearts of all, who considers everything they do.

- B. <u>Nothing in this life can separate us from the love of God.</u>

II. Big and Small

- A. <u>The infinite God reveals Himself to us in the intimate things.</u>
 - 1) Isaiah 57:15

"I live in a high and holy place, but also with the one who is contrite and lowly in spirit, to revive the spirit of the lowly and to revive the heart of the contrite."

- 2) CHRISTIAN EXISTENTIALISM
 - a) Rationalism—the universe can be understood by reason and intellect
 - b) Existentialism—the universe is a mystery, and meaning is on personal level
 - i) Pessimism—life is mostly pain and suffering

- ii) Nihilism—life is meaningless
- iii) Absurdism—life can only be accepted as absurd

 - 1) **Philippians 4:4-5** *Rejoice in the Lord always. I will say it again: Rejoice! Let your gentleness be evident to all. The Lord is near.*
 - 2) EVERYTHING EVERYWHERE ALL THE TIME
 - 3) When the God-forsaken worldliness of earthly life shuts itself in complacency, the confined air develops poison, the moment gets stuck and stands still, the prospect is lost, a need is felt for a refreshing, enlivening breeze to cleanse the air and dispel the poisonous vapors lest we suffocate in worldliness . . . Lovingly to hope all things is the opposite of despairingly to hope nothing at all. Love hopes all things—yet is never put to shame.
